Reference: Brokering Registration Statement, Transmittal Letter and Fee Submission

Dear Mr. Olson:

The Office of Defense Trade Controls Compliance, Compliance and Registration Division (CRD), received your registration application, transmittal letter and fee to register as a broker. Our review is now completed. Your brokering registration code is K-4102. It expires on 06/30/2012.

Section 38(b)(1)(A)(ii) of the Arms Export Control Act (AECA) (22 U.S.C. 2778) provides that persons engaged in the business of brokering activities with respect to the manufacture, export, import, or transfer of any U.S. or foreign defense article or defense service shall register and pay a registration fee and that no person may engage in the business of such brokering activities without a license issued in accordance with the AECA. This registration serves as a precondition to submitting an application for a brokering license or other approval from the Directorate of Defense Trade Controls (DDTC). Further, this registration does not satisfy any independent requirement to register as an exporter pursuant to International Traffic in Arms Regulations (ITAR) Part 122, if so required by the AECA or ITAR.

As a registered broker you are required to comply with other sections of the ITAR as well as those specific to Part 129 on brokering activities. These include Parts 120, 121, 122, 126, 127 and 130. These Parts cover general authorities and eligibility, the United States Munitions List, Registration of Manufacturers and Exporters, Prohibited Exports and Sales to Certain Countries, Prohibited Countries, Violations and Penalties, and Political Contributions, Fees and Commissions. Please note that Part 122 also include requirements for notifying this Office of changes to your Registration Statement or Transmittal Letter.


ITAR Section 129.9 requires that any person registered as a broker provide annually a report to DDTC (Attn: the Office of Defense Trade Controls Compliance, Compliance and

Registration Division). This report is due on January 31 each year. However, you must comply with ITAR Section 122.5, which requires you to maintain records concerning your registration and your brokering activities for a minimum period of five years from the expiration of the license or other approval to include the use of exemptions. Records maintained shall be available at all times for inspection and copying by this Office or by Customs officials.

Please include your brokering registration code and the following statement on all registration correspondence to this Office: "Under penalty according to federal law (22 CFR 127.2; 22 USC 2778; 18 USC 1001) I, (insert your name), as authorized by (name of company, if applicable) warrant the truth of the statements made herein." Again, your registration must be submitted for renewal to your registration at least 30 days prior to its expiration date (ITAR Section 122.3(b)). Registration must be current to apply for brokering licenses or other approvals, or to use brokering exemptions. Current also means notifying this Office of any changes to your transmittal letters or material change in the information contained in your registration application (Section ITAR 122.4).
